Poom Prommachart completed his Bachelor's and Master's degrees as well as his Artist Diploma at the Royal College of Music (RCM), in London, in 2014 on full scholarship, sponsored by H.R.H Princess Galyani Vadhana of Thailand and the RCM. During his time in London, he won the prestigious Tagore Gold Medal, presented by H.R.H. the Prince of Wales upon graduation. Poom Prommachart is currently based in Montreal, pursuing his Doctorate of Music under the tutelage of Dang Thai Son and Jean Saulnier at the Université de Montréal.

Poom Prommachart's international performing career began with a First Prize at the Fifth Isidor Bajic International Piano Competition in Serbia in 2010, First Prize at the Thailand International Piano Competition in 2011, and First Prize at the Sussex International Piano Competition in 2013. He has worked with a number of distinguished orchestras including the Montevideo Philharmonic Orchestra, the London Symphony Orchestra, the Timisoara Philharmonic Orchestra, the Ealing Symphony Orchestra, the National Symphony Orchestra of Serbia, the Worthing Symphony Orchestra and the Vojvodina Symphony Orchestra. Recent major concert engagements include piano recitals at Rachmaninoff Hall in Moscow, Belgrade Kolarac Hall in Serbia, Seoul Arts Center in Seoul and Busan, South Korea, Esplanade Hall in Singapore, South Bank and Royal Albert Hall in the U.K., Music Festival Perugia in Italy, Joseph-Woelfl-Gesellschaft Bonn in Germany, and Suntory Hall in Japan.

Most recently, Poom Prommachart won First Prize and the Chapelle historique du Bon-Pasteur at the 2020 edition of the Orchestre de l'Université de Montréal's Concerto Competition.
